Carol's Corner Even with the best care, pets can get lost. Report your lost pet to the WCHS and the Wallowa County Sheriff's Office with a full description including name, date and place last seen, any ID or microchip information and your contact information. Leave an article of clothing with your scent on it where you last saw your pet. Call KWVR and the local veterinarians. Post an ad on Wallowa Valley Free Classifieds or other social media. Create flyers with a picture of your pet, a description and your contact information and post around the County. WCHS has seen much success reuniting lost pets and their owners using these methods.
